Maryland Needs a Bottle Bill! HB 735 / SB 642

People of faith, we must protect God's creation! After 10 years of trying and failing, the Maryland Assembly is once again considering a Bottle Bill that would add a small deposit to the purchase price of beverage containers that is refunded to customers when the containers are returned by customers for recycling. Based on evidence from other states with such recycling programs in place, a Maryland program could capture more than 3 billion additional beverage containers annually, including 2 billion plastic

bottles. This year's bill has sponsors from both the House of Delegates and the Senate, with hearings scheduled this week and next. Now is the time to write to your delegates and senator! Send each one a letter of support for the bottle bill, citing the bill numbers above. Tell them you are from St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Bethesda, and tell them why you care about this bill. Hearing from constituents makes a difference to legislators! Thank you for being stewards of God's creation.
